Signatures

All parties' signature must be in one of the following acceptable formats:

- Original paper petition signed in ink;
- Scanned copy of original, ink-signed paper petition; or
- Digital signature

District proponents will collect all original (hard copy) and electronic petition forms from property owners for submission to the Glendale Planning Division. The proponents will provide property owners with information regarding how to submit paper or electronic versions of the signed petition forms.

Scanned Signatures

The property owner may sign, in ink, a printed petition form, scan the form as a PDF document, and submit it electronically (e.g. via email) as directed by the survey proponents. This signature is only legal if the property owner certifies that the original, signed document is available for inspection and copying at the request of the City, a court, or any other party. The signature is subject to the declaration on the petition form that, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of California, the information submitted is true and correct.

Digital Signatures

The property owner may add a digital signature to an electronic copy of the petition (using a proprietary signature tool such as Docusign, Adobe Sign, etc.) subject to the declaration on the petition form that, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of California, the information submitted is true and correct.

Property Ownership

"Owner of Property" shall be one of the following: (1) Where the property is held by one individual, the petition shall be signed by that individual; (2) Where the property is held in a form of co-tenancy, including joint tenancy, tenants in common, tenants in partnership or community property, then each such co-tenant shall be required to sign the petition; (3) Where the property is held by a business entity, such as a corporation, limited partnership, or limited liability, an authorized agent of such business entity shall sign the petition; (4) Where the property is a common interest development, as defined in California Civil Code Section 1351, the authorized agent of the homeowners association or other agent designated in the common interest development's governing documents shall sign the petition; or (5) Where the property is held in trust, all co-trustees shall sign the petition unless the California Probate Code allows otherwise.
